<p>phases</p>	<p>Changes as the moon moves.</p>	 A circular diagram showing the eight phases of the moon: Waxing Gibbous, First Quarter, Waxing Crescent, Full, New, Waning Crescent, Third Quarter, and Waning Gibbous. The moon is shown in the center, with the phases arranged around it in a clockwise cycle.
<p>new moon</p>	<p>The phase of the moon at which the moon, as viewed from Earth, does not appear to be illuminated by the sun</p>	 A photograph of a new moon, which is a thin, dark crescent of light against a dark blue night sky.
<p>first quarter</p>	<p>The phase of the moon at which the moon, as viewed from Earth, appears to be half illuminated by the sun on its westernmost side.</p>	 A photograph of a first quarter moon, showing a half-illuminated disk with the right side lit against a black background.
<p>full moon</p>	<p>The phase of the moon at which the moon, as viewed from Earth, appears to be fully illuminated by the sun</p>	 A photograph of a full moon, showing a completely illuminated, bright white disk against a black background.

<p>third quarter</p>	<p>The phase of the moon at which the moon, as viewed from Earth, appears to be half illuminated by the sun, on its easternmost side.</p>	
<p>star</p>	<p>Is an object in the sky that gives off its own light.</p>	
<p>clouds</p>	<p>A visible body of very fine water droplets or ice particles suspended in the atmosphere</p>
